

VAMPSS – Vaccines and Medications in Pregnancy Surveillance System

VAMPSS is a ground-breaking system designed to study the safety of medications and vaccines in pregnancy, and is currently focusing on the safety of long-acting beta-agonists and flu vaccines.

MotherToBaby Pregnancy Studies, conducted by the Organization of Teratology Information Specialists (OTIS), runs the cohort arm of VAMPSS. The research coordinating center for MotherToBaby studies is located at the University of California, San Diego.

The purpose of the OTIS Asthma Medications and Pregnancy Study is to look at pregnancy outcomes; such as birth defects, preterm birth and fetal growth, in infants of women who do or do not take asthma medications in pregnancy. The study is observational, which means participants are not asked to take medications or vaccinations.

Participation includes:

- 2-3 phone interviews during pregnancy
- One phone interview after delivery
- Release of medical records relating to pregnancy
